& STANDARDS OF CONDUCT**

Wear clothing that is neat, clean and modest at all times. Do not bring clothing that is tight fitting. No clothing that is revealing will be permitted. Do not bring T-shirts with secular graphics or “sayings” on them. Sweats are allowed for recreation only.

No midriffs. Many clothes today are made where the jeans are lower and the shirts are higher (exposing skin around the midsection and back side. This is very evident when sitting down and bending over. In working with children, there many times when sitting and bending is a part of the constant activity. Therefore, this type of shirt and jeans/pants are not allowed at CYIA training.

Shorts are allowed at CYIA training. But, they cannot be short shorts.

Any non-modest attire will be addressed by a staff person of the same sex and obedience is expected.

The wearing of hats is not allowed inside the classrooms or when teaching a 5-Day Club.

Guys:

Must be neat at all times. Khakis, jeans, or long shorts may be worn to classes and 5-Day Clubs. No baggie drooping pants. No tank tops.

Females:

Must be neat at all times. Dresses or skirts of modest length, slacks, long shorts or jeans may be worn during CYIA Training School. No tank tops, low-cut necklines or spaghetti straps.

At CYIA Training, this standard of dress will be maintained. Since you are working under CEF this summer, you are a visible representation of our ministry. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding. If you have any questions, please see your Local CEF Staff.

GENERAL STANDARDS

1. CEF of Alabama cannot provide telephone service during CYIA Training. Emergency calls can be made to (334)201-3501 Ed Solomon's cell phone number. Please get your Local CEF Staff person's cell phone number prior to CYIA Training.
2. All activities will be under Staff supervision.
3. Boy-Girl relationships will be on hold during CYIA Training. This means no "pairing-up", as well as, holding hands, hugging, etc.
4. All Staff and Teens are expected to be at every meal and on time. We will pray together out front of the dining hall before going in for meals.
5. Remember, Lights Out Time. Be courteous to allow the Staff and Teens that need REST to be able to get their rest.
6. For the benefit of the Staff, the back row of tables and/or chairs in the classroom will be reserved for the Staff.
7. You must keep up with your own teaching materials and CYIA notebook.
8. Name Tags will be issued so that we can know who is who – please wear the name tag so you can be identified.
9. Recreation is planned at different times to help Teens and Staff to release some tension. You are asked to participate unless there is a valid medical reason not to.
10. **Anything that is "questionable" should be left at home. Do not bring iPods, cell phones with internet, MP3 players, CD players, video games, or any other electronic device (except an alarm clock and camera).**
11. Cell phones are only permitted during designated times and will be turned off during class hours, as well as, other activities deemed necessary by the Staff. Parents, we would ask for your cooperation regarding phone calls to your teen. We want you to know that your child is a phone call away, but do ask that you contact them during appropriate times in the schedule unless it is an emergency.
12. Any issue that is not addressed here will be addressed at the time it comes up.
13. Boys are not allowed into the Girl's lodging rooms and the Girls are not allowed into the Boys lodging rooms at any time. No exceptions.

7. Towels, sheets, pillows, and/or a sleeping bag.
8. Snacks are allowed.
